She was Assistant Principle flutist of the Xalapa, Vera Cruz Orchestra in Mexico, and has performed with the Owensboro Symphony, the Brooklyn Philharmonic, the Harlem Festival Orchestra, Opera Ebony, the Dance Theatre of Harlem, Alvin Ailey, the Chinese Music Ensemble of New York, and others. In the Broadway show, *Miss Saigon*, she played Western flute, piccolo and Asian bamboo flutes.

Paula has worked as an artist/educator for the Kennedy Center, the Los Angeles Music Center, the Lincoln Center Institute, the New York Philharmonic, the Brooklyn Philharmonic, and others, as well as a music education specialist for the Midori and Friends Foundation. She has been on the faculty of Juilliard's Music Advancement Program since 1994, presently teaching flute.

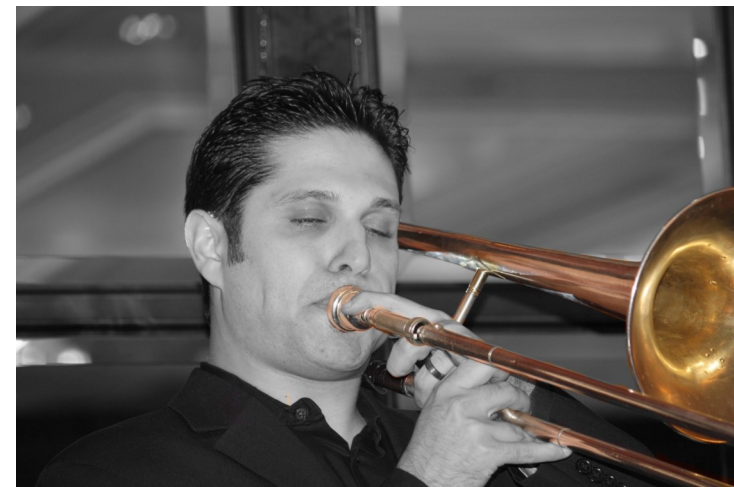
John Guarino, Violin & Piano
